There has been no "Chieftain" coverage of the Feb. 26, 2014 SEC Board of Trustees meeting which is unfortunate as actions taken at that meeting will have profound effect on the future of the SEC and electric service in the area.

KOB, Channel 4 has sent an investigative team out to the area to look into one of the worst actions of management, attorneys, and the board officers and majority of three (they are the same). The case concerns Colette Foard, the Trail's End Market and the refusal of the above trio to issue the Capital Credits although the Attorney General of New Mexico and others have ruled that they are owed.
